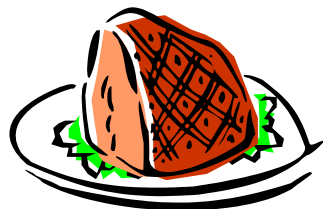
Rev. Donna Wilson will be starting **confirmation classes**.
