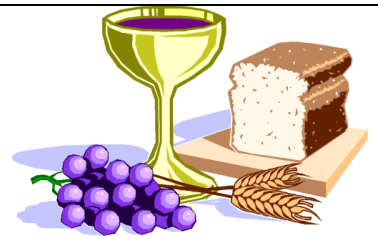





We also need a scripture reader for each week.
